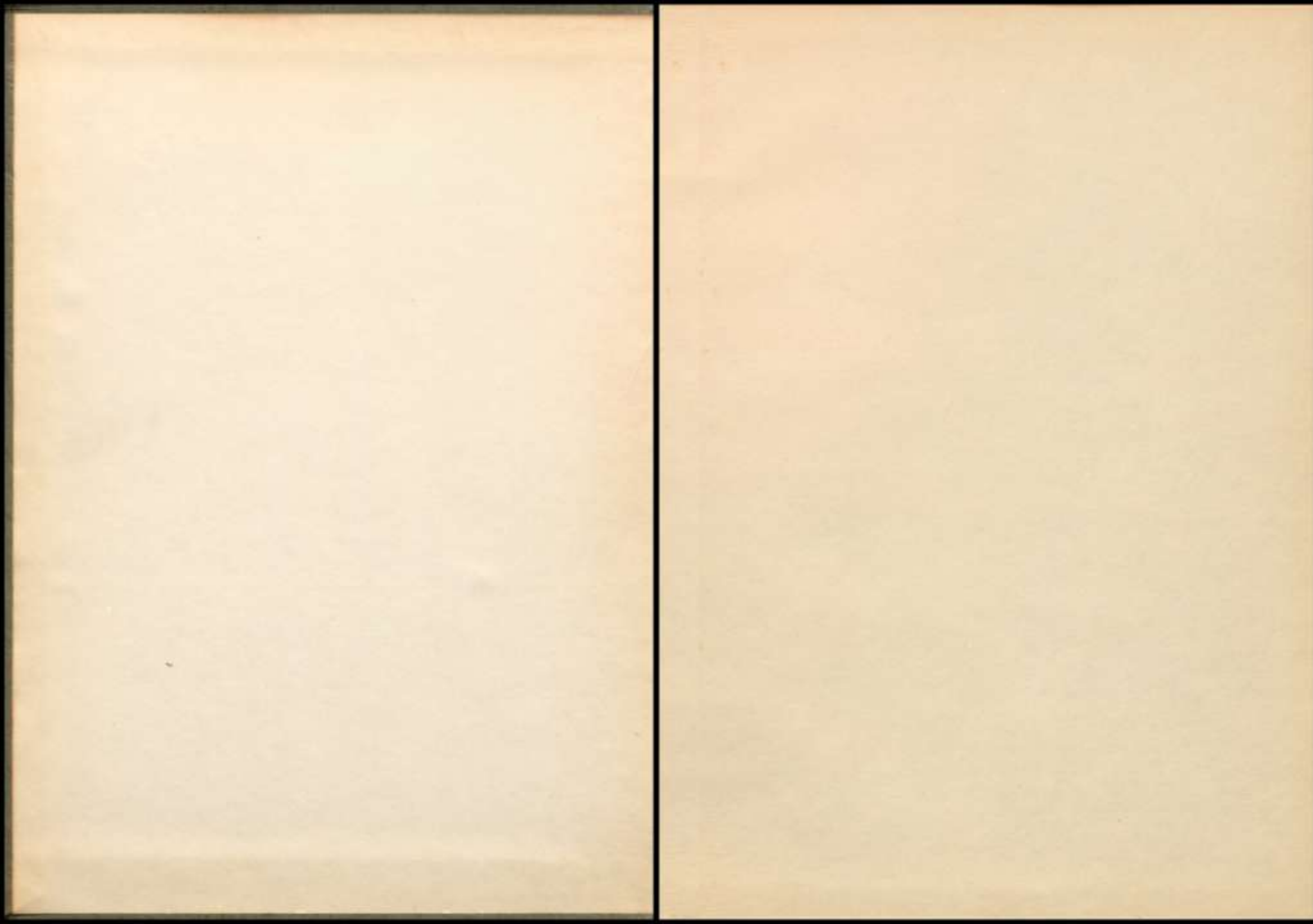


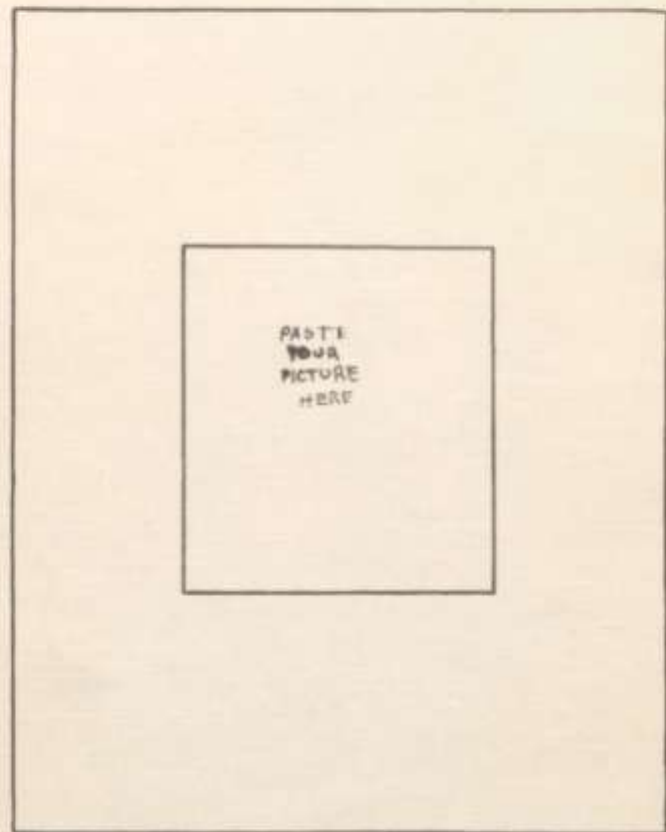

MR. C. E. GREEBON JR.

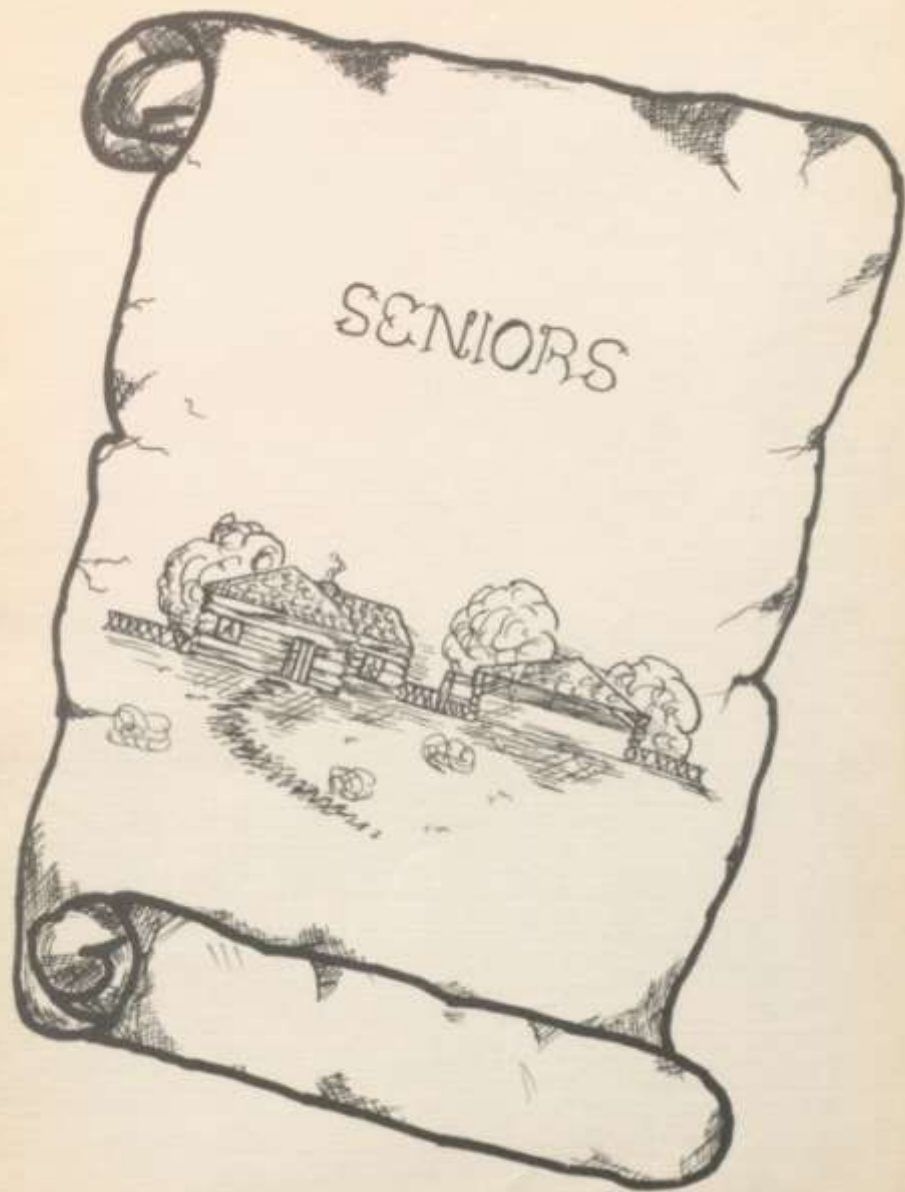
Mr. Greebon is a favorite among the boys in high school. He coaches football, basketball, tennis, volley-volleyball, and track.

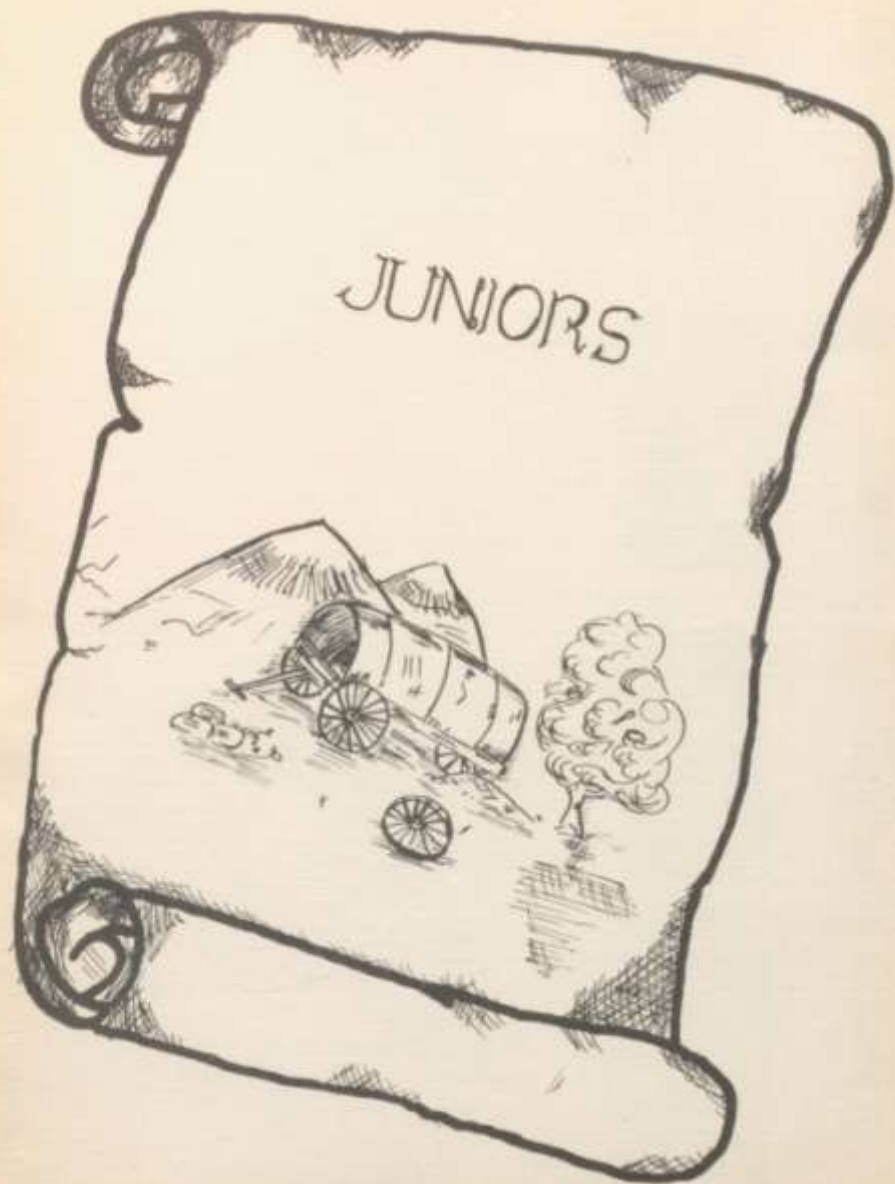


BETTY MAE BLACKBURN

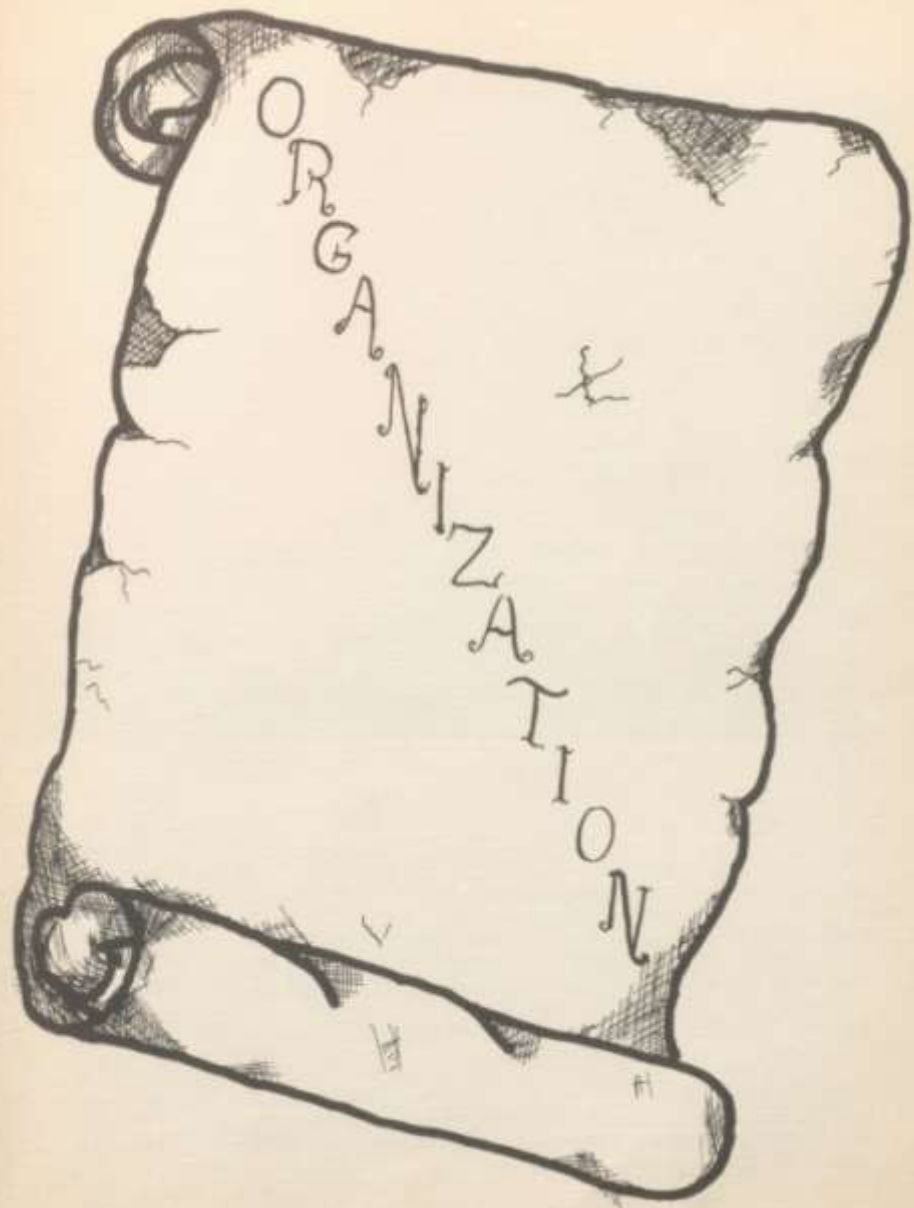

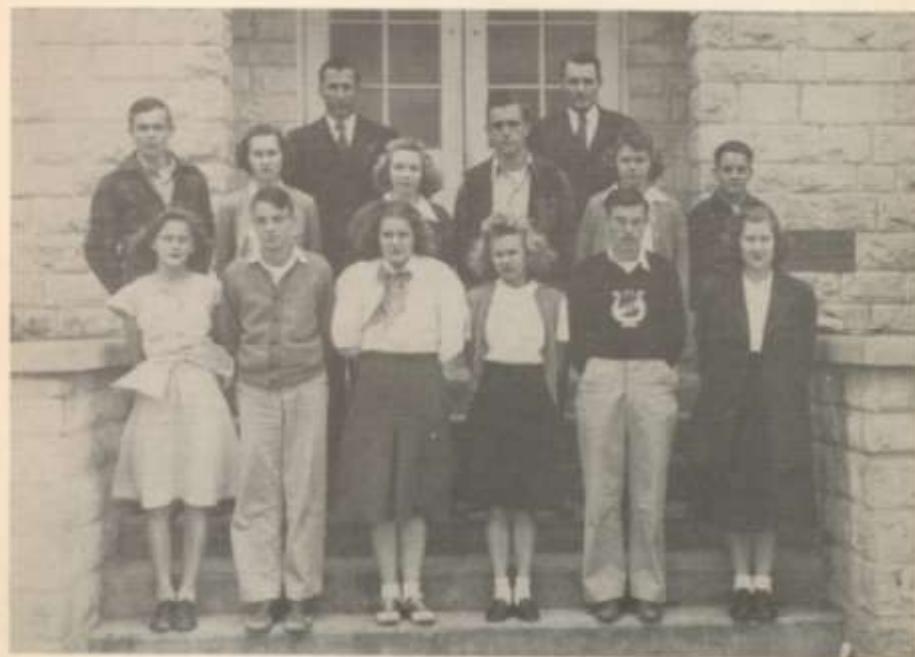

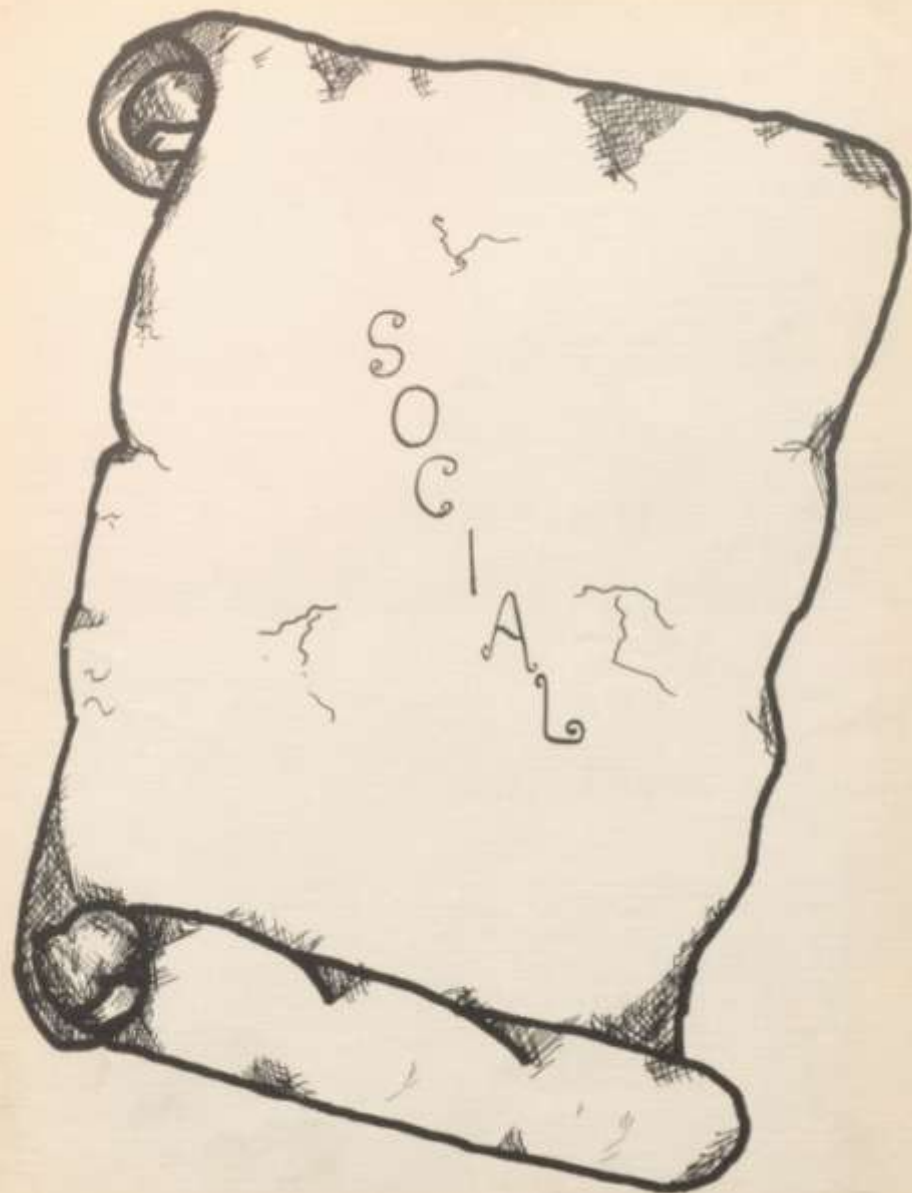

The first Wednesday of every school-year month we had a very interesting and entertaining program in the school auditorium. Our meetings consisted of a program by the different grades in school and then a guest speaker and our regular business.

The home making department had a style show one meeting and honored the P. T. A. with a lovely tea in the homemaker room after the meeting adjourned.

Every program, by every grade was well planned and very good as well as inspirational.

Our year has been rather busy as we needed funds for many things we wanted for our school.

After the first night performance we honored the cast of the minstrel and our school band with a reception in the homemaker room. Mrs. Cavett with the help of Bessie Mae Meserole, Nina Jo Page and Lillian Mueller served delicious refreshments.

The proceeds of the minstrel were used to buy play ground equipment for the grammar school. Three swing sets, a beautiful slide, to repair the see-saws. There was also \$30.00 set aside for a fund for films for the visual aid machine and a stand for its speakers was bought for about \$24

The balance of these proceeds was added to a \$25.00 check contributed to the P. T. A. by Mr. Al Buchanan to buy silverware for our homemaker room.

We plan to buy a service for sixteen in good silver plate and have arranged to sell cold drinks at the baseball games during the summer and plan to finish our silver service for forty with the proceeds.

The Annual Staff, speaking for the school as a whole, wishes to thank Mrs. Worthy and those persons working with her for making it possible for the school to have new equipment, and many other such needed things.

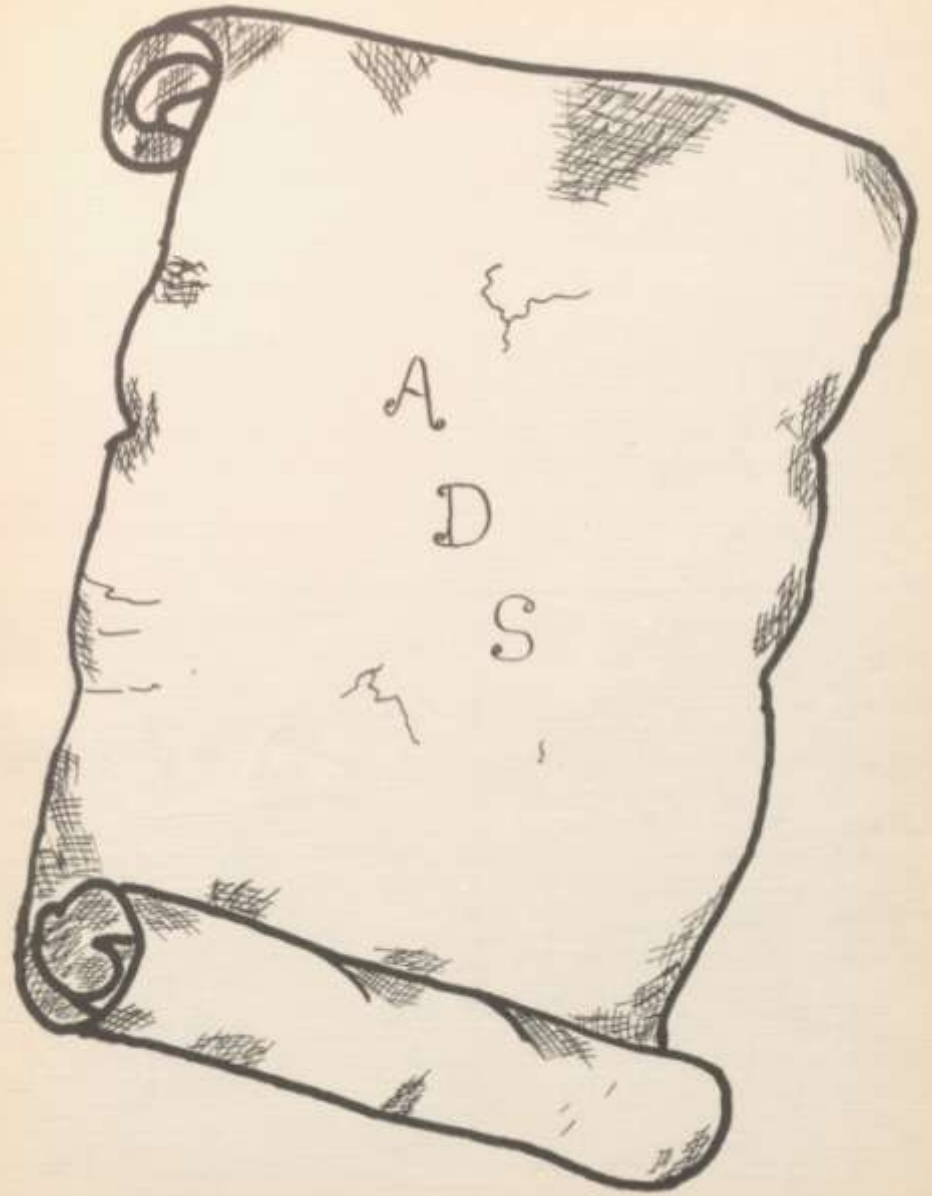
