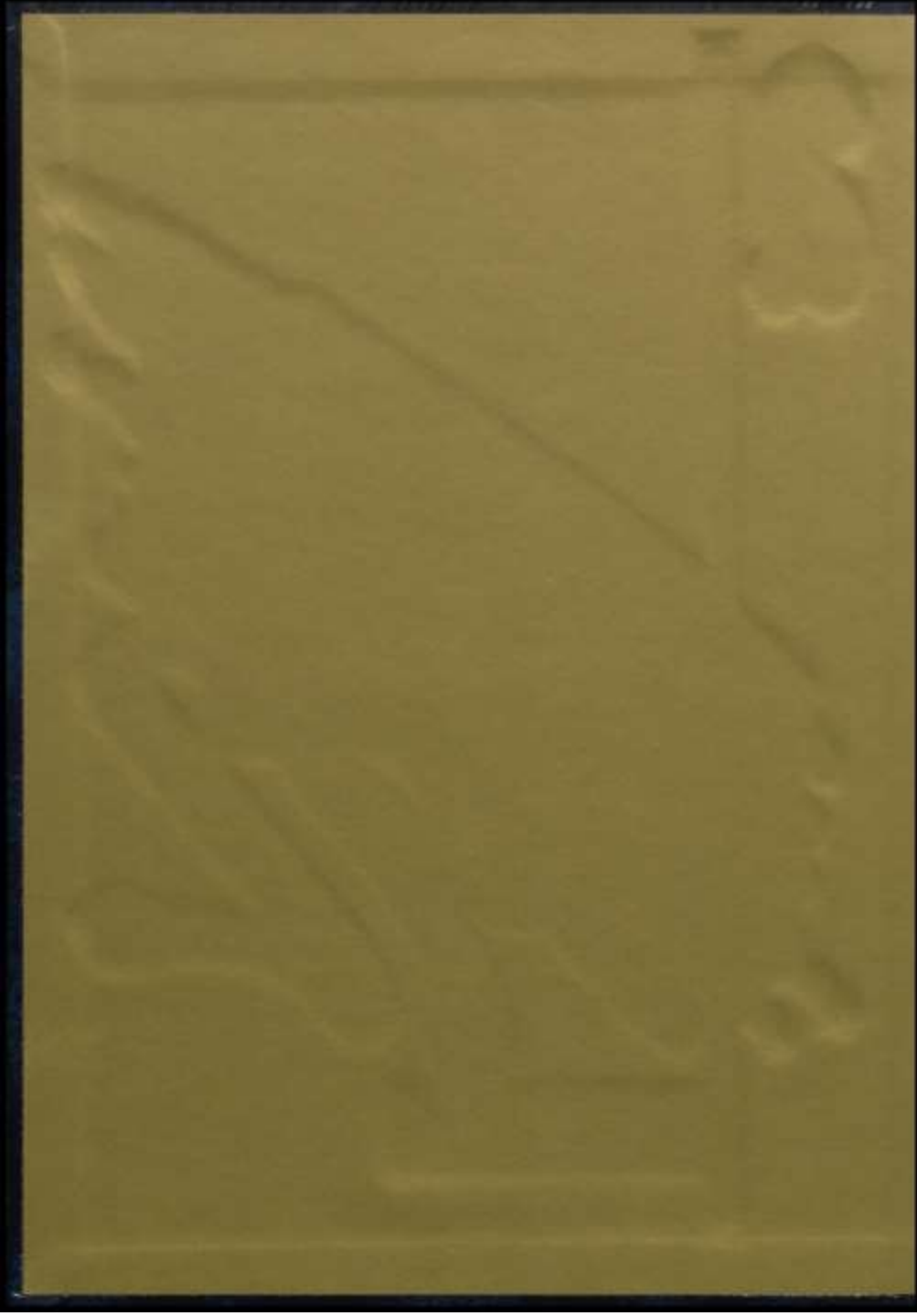

## Seniors chose leaders who would help them to make the best decisions for their last year at BHS



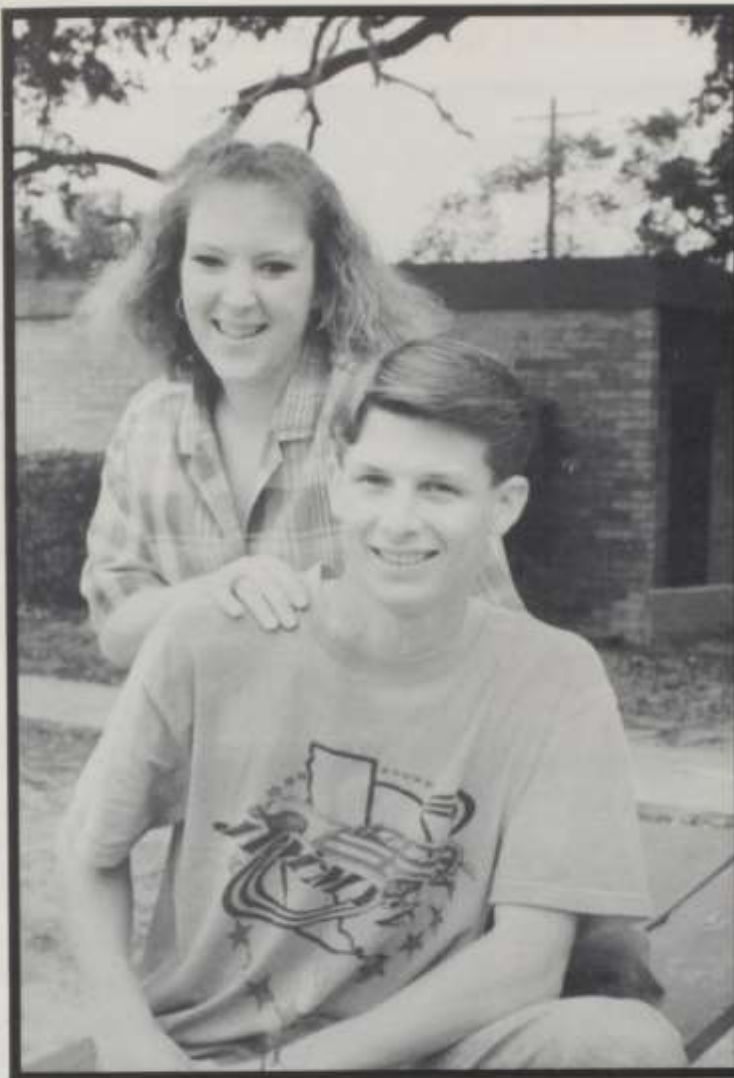

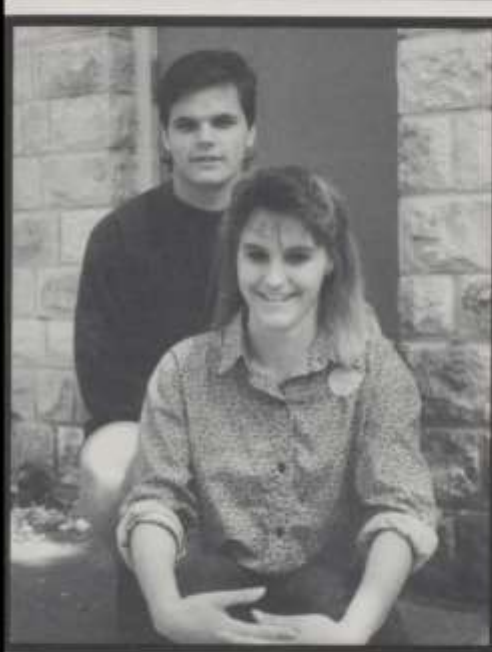
