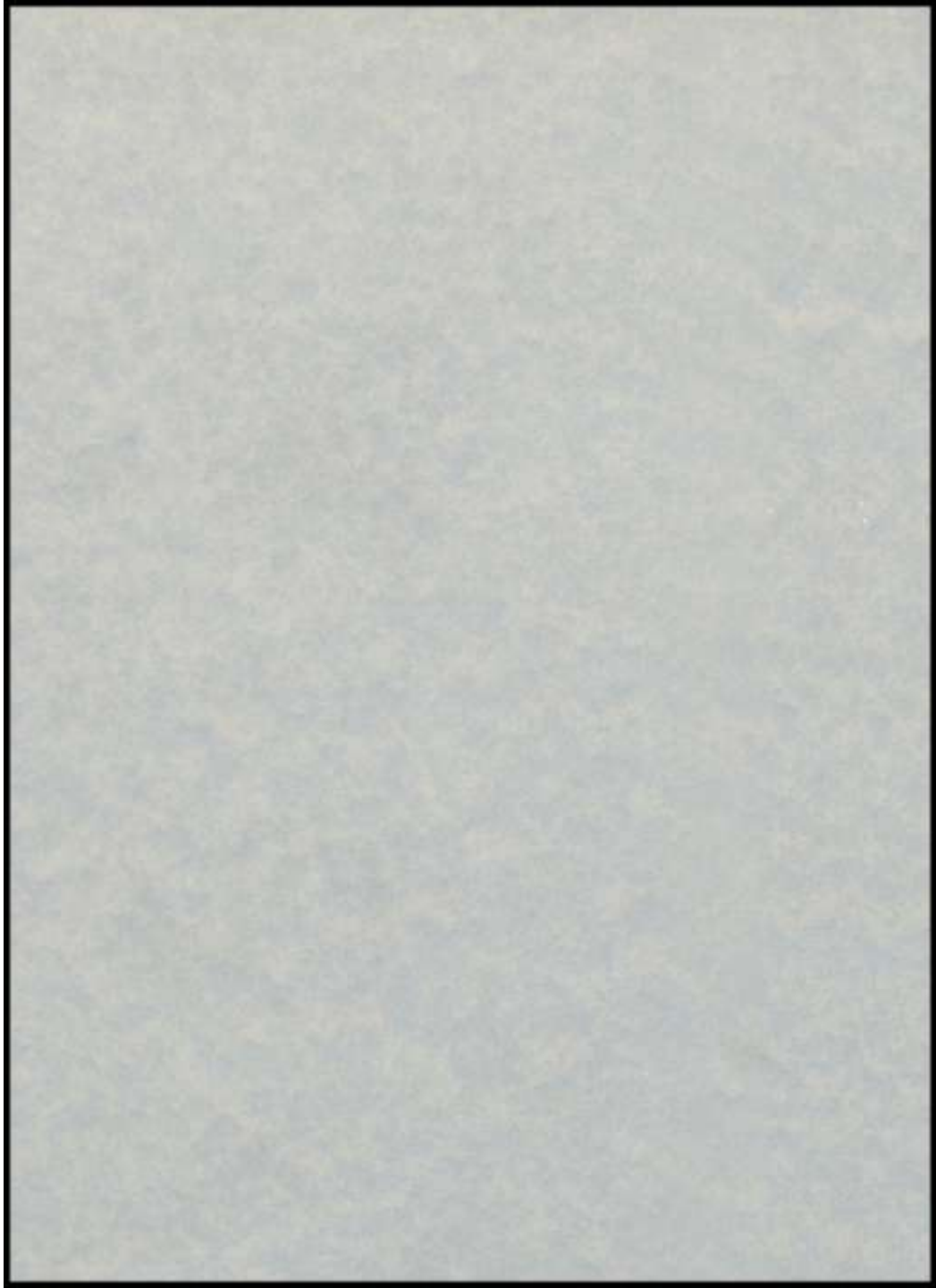

## Panther Chat and Yearbook Staff wants the reader to *take a closer look* at the life of BISD through words and pictures

The yearbook staff encourages everyone to *take a closer look* at BISD because there are lots of good things going on from good, useful education to lifetime friendships being formed.

*Taking a closer look* (via the yearbook) costs more this year—the price increased from \$20 to \$25. The reason for the increase is basically the enrollment, which has increased over 60 students from last year (762 last year, 831 this year). We have 42 candidates for graduation, 58 are coming in as freshmen next year, and kindergarten is expected to be over 65.

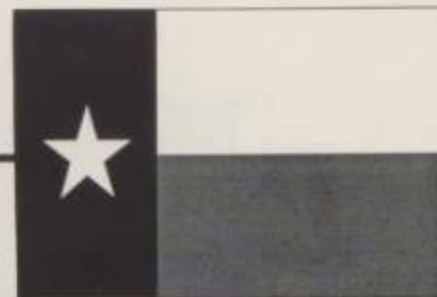
It is hard to believe, but Little "B" is growing. All three schools are separate entities, each with their own principal and building. This is the "90's"!

## Board 'takes a closer look' to improve BISD education

Superintendent Mike Adkins (left), board president Kent Weber, Dr. David Behrens, vice president Jim Pepper, and Dennis Moore pore over the architect's plans for the high school's new wing. Because of increased enrollment, options facing the board are: 1. building a new middle school, 2. moving the middle/elementary school, 3. adding portable buildings.



Above: Adding the six additional high school classrooms completes the school board's plans for the high school for the next five years if 3% growth continues. Construction should be complete for the 1995-96 school year. The board financed the new rooms from changes in tax distribution to school districts over the past few years. Focus must now be on the middle and elementary school. Middle school has as many students as high school had when it moved over to the Rocky Road location in November, 1993. Elementary school's enrollment is growing at the projected 5%, and if the school does not expand, next year it will face the same crowded conditions that existed in 1993 when the building held both elementary and middle school.

## Computer Science makes it two in a row



The 1995 Computer Science Team composed of Senior Roger Knoese, Junior Courtney Kovich, and Junior Jeremy Pope won 1st place in the State UIL 2A Computer Science Contest in Austin. There were more than 200 district 2A schools in Texas that competed at the district level. When a school advances to the state meet in May, they represent the very best in the state. Compared to all classifications, 5A through 1A, Blanco's team ranked 5th out of the 28 teams in the entire state. Sponsor, James Candell said, "This is the most outstanding Computer Science Team I have had the pleasure to coach." In 1993, Carl Johnson, Cory Fuchs, and Gavin Smith won 1st in state.
